Abel-Smith, Robert Eustace

Born March 24, 1909 at Cadogan Square, London SW1, son of Eustace Abel Smith, JP. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1927. BA 1930. Captain, 3rd Grenadier Guards. Died May 21, 1940. Buried in Esquelmes War Cemetery, Hainaut, Belgium. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Ades, Edmund Henry [Edmond]

Born July 24, 1918 in Alexandria, Egypt. Son of Elie Ades and the Hon. Mrs Rose O'Brien. Charterhouse School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1936. BA 1939. Lieutenant, 2nd Royal Gloucestershire Hussars, Royal Armoured Corps. Died May 27, 1942. Buried in Knights-bridge War Cemetery, Libya. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Aguirre, Enrique Manuel

Born May 25, 1903, in Anerley, Middlesex. Son of Enrique Blois [or Blas] and Henrietta Emma Aguirre. School, St Edmund's College, Ware, Herts. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1921. BA 1925. Of 152 Croydon Road, Anerley, Kent. Died Sept. 25, 1941 as a civilian, c/o S.S. *Avoceta*. Commemorated in Westminster Abbey. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Allanson, Kenneth Austin

Born March 2, 1924 at Lythe, North Riding, Yorkshire. Son of William Allanson. Wokingham Grammar School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1942. Private, 4th King's Shropshire Light Infantry. Died March 2, 1945. Buried in Reichswald Forest War Cemetery, Nordrhein-Westfalen, Germany. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Allhusen, Frederick Eden

Born Feb. 26, 1917, in London. Son of Lt-Col. Frederick Allhusen, CMG, DSO. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935. BA 1938. Lieutenant, then Captain, Royal Armoured Corps, 15th/19th Battalion, The King's Royal Hussars. **Military Cross**. Died Jun 17, 1941. Buried in Stoke Poges (St Giles) Churchyard, Buckinghamshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Amos, Colin Sheldon

Born Nov. 29, 1913, at Gezira, Cairo, Egypt. Son of Sir Maurice Sheldon Amos, KC, of Ulpha, Cumberland. Leighton Park School, Reading. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1932. BA 1935. Driver, Royal Army Service Corps. Died Aug. 4, 1940. Buried in Ulpha (St John) New Churchyard. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Anderson, Ian Francis

Born Feb. 25, 1917, in Wokingham, Berks. Son of Lt-Col. Francis Anderson, DSO, MC. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935. BA 1938. Pilot Officer, RAF, 53 Squadron. Died April 9, 1941. Buried in Wokingham (All Saints) Churchyard. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Anderson, John Thomson McKellar

'Jock' Anderson was born Jan. 12, 1918, in Hampstead, London; son of John McNicol McKellar Anderson. Stowe School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1936. BA 1939. Married to Moira Anderson, of Chessington, Surrey. Major, 8th Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. **Victoria Cross, DSO**. "During the attack on Longstop Hill, Tunisia, on 23rd April, 1943, Major Anderson, as leading Company Commander, led the assault on the battalion's first objective. Very heavy casualties were incurred, including the Commanding Officer killed and all other Company Commanders killed or wounded. Major Anderson re-organised the battalion, led the assault on the second objective, and, despite a leg wound, captured Longstop Hill with a total force of only four officers and less than forty other ranks. He personally led attacks on at least three enemy machine-gun positions and in every case was the first man in the enemy gun-pits. It is largely due to this officer's bravery and daring that Longstop Hill was captured, and it was the inspiration of his example that encouraged leaderless men to continue the advance." (*LG June 29, 1943*) Died Oct. 5 1943 at Termoli, Italy. Buried in Sangro River War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Anderson, Michael Herbert

Born Dec. 10, 1916, at Devonport, Devon. Son of John Sloane Anderson. School, Clifton College. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935. BA 1938. Married to Priscilla Ann (née Troughton), of Kingston, Lewes, Sussex. Pilot Officer, Royal Air Force, 600 Squadron. **Mentioned in Despatches**. Died May 10, 1940. Buried in Spijkenisse General Cemetery, Zuid-Holland, the Netherlands. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Arbuthnot, Myles Henry

Born Aug. 17, 1911, in Baltimore, Co. Cork, Ireland. Son of Major John Bernard Arbuthnot. School, Eton. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1929. BA 1935. Major, Royal Corps of Signals. **MBE**. Died Oct. 16, 1943. Buried in Bari War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Armitage, George Edward

Born Nov. 20, 1919, in Lincoln. Son of George William Armitage. City School, Lincoln. Admitted as State Scholar at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1938. BA 1941. Lieutenant, Royal Armoured Corps, 17th/21st Lancers. Died June 10, 1944. Buried in Rome War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Armitage, Stanley Rhodes

Born Dec. 16, 1902, in London. Son of Frederick Rhodes Armitage. Rugby School. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1921. BA 1924. Lieutenant, Royal Artillery, 7 Coast Regiment. **Mentioned in despatches**. Died Sept. 14, 1943. Commemorated on Singapore Memorial. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Ashton, Claude Thesiger

Born Feb. 19, 1901 in Calcutta, Bengal, India. Son of Hubert Shorrocks Ashton and Victoria Alexandrina (nee Inglis). School, Winchester College. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1920. BA 1923. Triple 'blue' for cricket, Association football and hockey. Full international cap for Association football. Married to Isabel (nee Norman-Butler). Of Ingatestone, Essex. Chartered accountant. Squadron Leader, Royal Air Force (Auxiliary Air Force), 256 Squadron. Died Oct. 31, 1942. Buried in Ingatestone and Fryerning Cemetery, Essex. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bailey, Douglas James

Born June 18, 1909, in Canterbury, Kent. Son of Lt-Col. Frederick George Glyn Bailey. Harrow School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1928. BA 1931. Married to Joan Sophie; of Childrey, Berks. Major, 2nd Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment). Died May 15, 1944. Buried in Cassino War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Baker Cresswell, Gilfrid Edward

Born July 15, 1914, in Edinburgh, Scotland. Son of Henry Gilfrid Baker Cresswell and Vera. Westminster School. Admitted as Pensioner (Royal Engineers Officer) at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1934. BA 1936. Married to Anne Sylvia; of Chathill, Northumberland. Major, Royal Engineers. Died Oct. 27, 1942. Buried in El Alamein War Cemetery, Egypt. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Balfour, Anthony Melville

Born Dec. 11, 1916, at 18 Wilton Crescent, London SW. Son of Melville Balfour, MC, and Margaret Mary; of Wintershill Hall, Hampshire. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935. Captain, 1st Scots Guards. **Military Cross**. Died Feb. 9, 1944. Buried in Beach Head War Cemetery, Anzio, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Ball, Brian Francis

Born May 15, 1912, at Mellor, Derbyshire. Son of Frank Norman Ball and Alice, of Westcliff-on-Sea, Essex. St Bees School, Cumberland. Adm. as Pens. at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1931. BA 1934. Associate Member of the Institute of Electrical Engineers. Pilot Officer, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 218 Squadron. Died June 26, 1942. Commemorated at Runnymede Memorial, Surrey. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Ballantine Dykes, Thomas Lamplugh

Born June 30, 1912, at Dovenby Hall, Cockermouth, Cumberland. Son of Col. Hubert Frescheville Ballantine Dykes, DSO, OBE, of Broughton-in-Furness, Lancs. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1930. BA 1933. Major, 2nd Scots Guards. Died June 13, 1942. Buried in Knightsbridge War Cemetery, Acroma, Libya. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Balston, James Peter Henry

Born May 18, 1913, in Maidstone, Kent. Son of Francis William Balston. School, Malvern College. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1931. BA 1934 (Mechanical Science Tripos). Married to Penelope. Flying Officer, RAF (Auxiliary Air Force), 500 Squadron. Died March 27 1940. Commemorated at Runnymede Memorial, Surrey. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barbour, Robert James

Born Nov. 7, 1920 at Broxton, Cheshire. Son of Major Robert Barbour. Harrow School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1939. Lieutenant, 3rd Welsh Guards. Died Feb. 11, 1944. Buried in Cassino War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barclay, Richard George Arthur

Born Dec. 7, 1919, at 15 Highland Road, Upper Norwood, London SE19. Son of the Revd Gilbert Arthur Stanley, of Langley Rectory, Maidstone, Kent. Stowe School. Admitted as Pens at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1938. Squadron Leader (Pilot), RAF Volunteer Reserve, 238 Squadron. Distinguished Flying Cross. Died July 17, 1942. Buried in El Alamein War Cemetery, Egypt. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barclay, William Maurice

Born Nov. 8, 1924 at Beaches Manor, Buntingford, Herts., son of Major Maurice Edward Barclay. School, Eton. Admitted as Entrance Scholar at Trinity, Jan. 5, 1943. Midshipman, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (HMS *Mahratta*). Died Feb. 25, 1944. Commemorated at Plymouth Naval Memorial, Devon. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Baring, Patrick

Born Oct. 1, 1919, at Gloucester Place, London SW7. Son of the Hon. Windham Baring, of Ightham, Kent; brother of Robert Windham (1932) and Mark (1935). School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1937. 2nd Lieutenant, 3rd Grenadier Guards. Died May 19, 1940. Buried in Outer Communal Cemetery, Oost-Vlaanderen, Belgium. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barker, Maurice Stuart

Born Aug. 16, 1916, at Watchbury, Barford, Warwickshire. Son of Kenward Stuart Barker, of Watchbury; brother of Nigel Hugh Stafford (1935). Stowe School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935. BA 1938.

Major, Royal Armoured Corps, 12th Royal Lancers. Died Nov. 5, 1941. Buried in Durban (Stellawood) Cemetery, Kwazulu Natal, South Africa. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barkley, Hugh Alastair Yuille

Born Oct. 10, 1921, at Weybridge, Surrey. Son of Thomas Yuille Barkley; brother of Thomas Ian Yuille (1943). School, Marlborough College. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Jan. 5, 1940. BA 1943. Flying Officer, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 640 Squadron. Died Feb. 16, 1944. Buried in Harrogate (Stonefall) Cemetery, Yorkshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Barnard, Robert Hugh

Born July 26, 1901, at St Patrick's, Solihull, Warwickshire. Son of Revd Gilbert William Barnard. School, Osborne and Dartmouth RN Colleges. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1922. BA 1925, MA 1932. Married to Dorothea Rose, of Vumba, Umtali, Southern Rhodesia. Captain, Gordon Highlanders. Mentioned in despatches. Died April 16, 1943. Commemorated at Rangoon Memorial, Myanmar, Burma. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bassett Wilson, Paul Francis

Born April 22, 1920, at Earls Court, London. Son of Captain Bassett Fitzgerald Wilson, of Chelsea, London. Stowe School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1938. Captain, Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers, No. 9 Commando Regiment. **Military Cross**. Died April 2, 1945. Buried in Ravenna War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Beale, Edmund Arthur

Born June 14, 1911, at Edgbaston, Birmingham. Son of Edmund Hipson Beale, of Birmingham. Rugby School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1929. BA 1932. Flying Officer, Royal Air Force (RAFO). Died Sept. 5, 1940. Buried in Whitegate (St Mary) Churchyard, Cheshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Beamish, John Otway Hamilton

Born June 15, 1919, at Weybridge, Surrey. Son of Rear-Admiral Tufton Percy Hamilton Beamish, CB DL MP, of Haywards Heath, Sussex. Stowe School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1937. BA 1940. Captain, Royal Artillery, 99 (The Royal Bucks. Yeomanry) Field Regiment. Died Jan. 31, 1945. Buried in Taukkyan War Cemetery, Myanmar, Burma. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Beaumont-Thomas, Nigel

Born April 17, 1916, at 11 Hyde Park Mansions, London. Son of Colonel Lionel Beaumont-Thomas, of South Kensington, London. Harrow School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1934. BA and Cert. Professional Engineering Studies, 1937. Lieutenant, Royal Engineers. Served in Egypt, East Africa, Western Desert, Sudan, Greece, Crete, Syria and Tobruk. **Military Cross**. Died Sept. 20, 1944. Buried in Arnhem Oosterbeek War Cemetery, Gelderland, Netherlands. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Beeston-Bancroft, [John] Bavis

Born Aug. 27, 1897, at Northwich, Cheshire. Son of William Bancroft, CC. Manchester University. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Jan. 8, 1919. BA 1922, MA 1930. MSc (Manchester). Aircraft Identifier, Royal Navy (HMS *President III*). Died June 24, 1944.

Commemorated at Portsmouth Naval Memorial, Hampshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bell, Clephan William Hamilton

Born Jan. 7, 1905, in Seymour Street, London. Son of Dr Robert Hamilton Bell. School, Winchester College. Admitted as Entrance Exhibitioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1923. BA 1926. Aircraftman 2nd Class, RAF. **Mentioned in despatches**. Died Dec. 3, 1942. Commemorated on Singapore Memorial. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bickersteth, Robert Langdale

Born Aug. 26, 1908, in Rodney Street, Liverpool. Son of Robert Alexander Bickersteth, FRCS. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1927. BA 1930, MA 1934. Married to Penelope (née Waterfield), of Kirkby Lonsdale, Westmorland. Major, 7th Seaforth Highlanders. Died June 26, 1944. Buried in St Manvieu War Cemetery, Cheux, Calvados, France. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Birch, Simon

Born March 15, 1921, at 22 Prince Albert Road, London NW. Son of Wyndham Lindsay Birch. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1939. Mistakenly recorded as killed in action, but the man killed was not the Simon Birch who attended Trinity. (Trinity Archivist)

Birchenough, Michael John

Born Feb. 16, 1914, at Macclesfield, Cheshire. Son of John Taylor Birchenough, of Prestbury, Cheshire. School, Eton, and private tuition. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1933. Trooper, Southern Rhodesia Armoured Car Regiment. Died Jan. 30, 1942. Buried in Addis Ababa War Cemetery, Ethiopia. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Birkbeck, John

Born Sept. 23, 1919, at King's Lynn, Norfolk. Son of Major Henry Anthony Birkbeck, MC, of Castle Acre. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1937. Flying Officer, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 96 Squadron. Died Sept. 6, 1942. Buried in West Acre (All Saints) Churchyd, Norfolk. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Birney, David Leslie

Born June 11, 1914, at Simla, Punjab, India. Son of Col. Charles Follitt Birney, DSO; brother of John Charles Ramsay (1930). Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1933. BA 1936. Married to Cecilie Mercedes Randell, of New Milton, Hampshire. Captain, Rifle Brigade and No. 2 Commando. Died April 28, 1942. Buried in Escoublac-la-Baule War Cemetery, Loire-Atlantique, France. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Blacker, Ian Frederick Edward

Born April 12, 1916, at Kinneagh, The Curragh, Co. Kildare, Ireland. Son of Col. Frederick St John Blacker, DSO. Harrow School, Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1934. BA 1937. Captain, Rifle Brigade, 10th (2nd Battalion The Tower Hamlets Rifles) Battalion. Died June 22, 1944. Buried in Assisi War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Blundell, Charles Sydenham

Born Feb. 4, 1913, in Plymouth, Devon. Son of Col. Charles Wilson Blundell, OBE TD. Sherborne School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1931. BA 1934. Married to Joan Gladys; of Fleet, Hants. Lieutenant-Commander (HMS *Carlisle*), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve. Died Oct. 9, 1943. Commemorated on Plymouth Naval Memorial, Devon. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Blundell-Hill, Christopher John

Born Jan. 12, 1923, at 9 Brunswick Walk, Cambridge. Son of Douglas Arthur Blundell-Hill, of West Kensington, London. School, Beaumont College. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, April 7, 1941. Flight Lieutenant, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 2 Squadron. Died April 1, 1945. Buried in Apeldoorn (Ugchelen-Heidehof) General Cemetery, Gelderland, Netherlands. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Blythswood, Lord

Campbell or **Douglas-Campbell, Philip Archibald** 7th Baron Blythswood. Born Feb. 19, 1919, in Weston-super-Mare, Somerset. Son of the Revd Leopold Colin Henry Douglas-Campbell, MA, 6th Baron Blythswood, and of Lady Blythswood (née Dumbleton), of Great Bookham, Surrey. School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1937. 2nd Lieutenant, Scots Guards. Died Sept. 13/14, 1940, aged 21. Buried in Inchinnan Parish (Old Hallows) Churchyard, Renfrewshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Boardman, Stuart Cozens-Hardy

Born July 26, 1904, in Town Close House, Norwich, Norfolk. Son of Edward Thomas Boardman, JP FRIBA. School, Malvern College. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1923. BA 1927, MA 1933. Married to Monica Mary Wells, of Ludham, Norfolk. Captain, 5th Royal Norfolk Regiment. Died Jan. 27, 1942. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. (*FWR, CWG*)

Bosanquet, Samuel John Anson

Born Dec. 1, 1911, in Kensington, London. Son of His Honour Sir Samuel Ronald Court-hope Bosanquet, KC, and of Lady Bosanquet (née Anson). School, Eton. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1930. BA 1933, MA 1937. Married to Daphne (née Griffith), of Little Marlow, Buckinghamshire. Lieutenant, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (HMS *Vatersay*). Died Oct. 25, 1944. Buried in Dingestow (St Mary) Churchyard, Monmouthshire. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Brant, Ronald Vickers

Born Nov. 29, 1907 in Portsmouth, Hants. Son of William Brant. Portsmouth Grammar School. Admitted as Sizar at Trinity Oct. 1, 1926, Exhibitioner 1928. BA 1929. Sapper, Johore Volunteer Engineers. Died Aug. 1, 1945. Buried in Kanchanaburi War Cemetery, Thailand. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Britton, Allan Walter Naylor

Born May 11, 1917, at Walderslade, Kent. Son of Noel Edward Britton. School, Fettes College, Edinburgh. Admitted as Entrance Scholar at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1935; Senior Scholar 1937. BA 1939. Woodward of Bitton Exhibition 1939. Flying Officer, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 263 Squadron. Died Dec. 12, 1940. Commemorated at Runnymede Memorial, Surrey. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Brooke, Paul Rigby Sinclair

Born July 24, 1912, at Pembury, Kent. Son of the Revd Henry Sinclair Brooke and Violet (nee Mason). Monkton Combe School. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1931. BA 1934. Pilot, RAF Volunteer Reserve, 9 Squadron. Died April 6, 1942. Buried in Rheinberg War Cemetery, Nord-rhein-Westfalen, Germany. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bruce, Robert Julian Thomas

Born July 31, 1913, at Normanton House, Aldershot, Hampshire. Son of Brigadier-General Thomas Bruce, CMG DSO. Rugby School. Admitted as Pensioner (Royal Engineers Officer) at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1934. BA 1936. Major, Royal Engineers. Died April 15, 1945. Buried in Coriano Ridge War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bruce-Dick, O.R.: see Dick

Buchanan, Arthur Geoffrey

Born July 26, 1919, in Albion Street, London. Son of Capt. John Nevile Buchanan, of Bledlow Ridge, Bucks. Stowe School. Admitted as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1937. Lieutenant, 6th Grenadier Guards. Died March 17, 1943. Buried in Sfax War Cemetery, Tunisia. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Buchanan, Douglas Lindley

Born Feb. 11, 1914, at Kenilworth, Capetown, South Africa. Son of Douglas Mudie Buchanan, KC, of Kenilworth, Cape Town. At Capetown University. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1932; BA 1935. Lieutenant, South African Air Force, 24 Squadron. Died July 2, 1941. Commemorated at Alamein Memorial, Egypt. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bull, Richard Henry

Born Aug. 21, 1910, in Woolwich, Kent. Son of Major Henry Bull, Royal Artillery, of West Burton, Sussex. Harrow School. Adm. as Pensioner at Trinity, Oct. 1, 1929. BA 1932. Major, Scots Guards, 1st Battalion. Military Cross. Died Jan. 30, 1944. Buried in Anzio War Cemetery, Italy. (*FWR, CWGC*)

Bulwer-Lytton, Alexander Edward John, Viscount Knebworth

“At 7.50 pm on the night of 14 October 1940, a high explosive bomb fell upon the inner edge of the Dean’s Yard block of buildings, demolishing rooms on the fifth and fourth floors and exploding on the third floor. It wrecked part of the Club premises and made a breach about thirty yards in length in the circular wall of the Assembly Hall. The Hall’s ornamental ceiling and its furniture were destroyed, the lantern and the copper roof were broken and the place was filled with debris.

“The remainder of the building was largely undamaged, owing to its steel framework construction, and three hundred people sheltering below in the basement were uninjured, but tragically six people in the building above were killed by falling masonry.

“In January 1941, the Censor released the names of those who had been killed. These included two members of the Council, Lionel Hitchens and Murray Buxton, also the latter’s brother, the missionary Alfred Buxton, and the recently appointed Assistant Secretary of the Church House, Henry Hall. A bronze memorial plaque, designed by the architect, was later placed in the vestibule to the Chapel.”

"Coke joined the RAF Volunteer Reserves in June 1939 and attended 5 OTU in April 1940. He was promoted to the rank of Acting Pilot Officer on 3 Sept. 1940. By August 1940 he flew a Hawker Hurricane with No. 257 Squadron RAF during the Battle of Britain as a Pilot Officer. He was involved in an incident on 12 August 1940 when his Hurricane (P3776) was badly shot up over the Channel off Portsmouth. His finger was amputated and the aircraft was repaired and used again. Posted to 46 Squadron in Dec. 1940, Coke was then promoted to the rank of Flying Officer. He went on to fight in the Balkans Campaign with No. 33 Squadron and the Syrian campaign with No. 80 Squadron RAF. During this period, he became friends with famed author Roald Dahl, as detailed in Dahl's autobiography *Going Solo*.

"While serving in Libya, Coke was awarded the DFC (Distinguished Flying Cross) for his work in an attack on enemy transport and for his leadership as a Flight Lieutenant.

"SFlight Lieutenant The Hon. David Arthur Coke (73042), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 80 Squadron (since missing). This officer participated in an attack on enemy transport on the El-Adem-Acroma road one day in November, 1941, in which a large number of vehicles, tanks and mechanised transport were bombed and machine-gunned. The damage inflicted played a very large part in the blocking of the road. By his skill and leadership, Flight Lieutenant Coke contributed materially to the success achieved. In addition to the low flying machine-gunning operations which have been carried out, Flt Lieut. Coke has led the Squadron with great success in air combat. During an engagement 2 days later, the Squadron shared in the destruction of 5 Messerschmitt 109s.'

"Killed in action by enemy Bf 109s in Acroma, Cyrenaica, Libya on Tues. 9 Dec. 1941, aged 26, and buried at Knightsbridge War Cemetery, Acroma (Ref. B.A.3. B.18)." (*Wikipedia*; *CWGC*)

Later he acted as a war correspondent, covering campaigns in Abyssinia and Madagascar, travelling vast distances by bicycle and canoe. At Tamatave in eastern Madagascar he came under heavy fire, leaping from an amphibious vessel carrying a bowler hat, a typewriter, and an umbrella. On Feb. 6, 1944 Gandar Dower boarded the SS *Khedive Ismail* at Kilindini Harbour at Mombasa, bound for Colombo. While approaching Addu Atoll in the Maldives, on Feb. 12, 1944, the vessel was attacked by Japanese submarine I-27. Struck by two torpedoes, the *Khedive Ismail* sank in two minutes, with a death toll of 1297, Gandar-Dower among them. Commemorated as a civilian in Westminster Abbey. (*Wikipedia*, *FWR*)

During that year, he volunteered for reserve service as a pilot with No. 601 (County of London) Squadron in the Auxiliary Air Force, acquired his Aviator's Certificate, and later assumed duties as a flight commander.

"In 1928 he co-founded Airwork Services (with Alan Muntz). In 1929, the company opened Heston Aerodrome that was active in private, commercial and military aviation until closure in 1947. In 1931, he was appointed Officer Commanding of No. 601 Squadron. In 1934, he transferred to the Auxiliary Air Force Reserve of Officers in the rank of Squadron Leader. He later commanded No. 110 Wing at Ringway.

"In partnership with architect Graham Dawbarn, he founded the consultancy firm of Norman and Dawbarn (1935), responsible for designs of buildings and lay-outs of many municipal airports in the UK and overseas, including Gatwick, Birmingham, Ringway, Jersey, and Guernsey. In 1939 he succeeded to the title 2nd Baronet of Honeyhanger.

"In 1940 he commanded the Central Landing Establishment. From the early days of World War II, he worked in close collaboration with the British Army on developing airborne troops. Norman controlled the air side of the first British paratroop raid on Italy shortly it after entered the war. He not only arranged all the details, but took a personal interest in all the numerous training exercises before the raid, and accompanied the paratroops on the expedition, returning regretfully, he said, in an aircraft, as he was not at that time a proficient parachutist. When he got back, he went on a parachute course. He distinguished himself in Operation Biting, the raid by British parachute troops on the coast of northern France in March 1942, when the radio location post at Bruneval, 12 miles north of Le Havre, was destroyed. It was a combined operation, the carrying force of RAF bombers under Norman's command and led by Wing Commander P. C. Pickard. His final appointment came in 1942, when he was appointed Air Officer Commanding No. 38 Wing. On May 19, 1943, Norman died in the post-crash fire when the Lockheed Hudson IIIA (FH168) that was to carry him to North Africa force-landed after take-off from RAF St Mawgan."
