The Cyrenians provides accommodation for over a hundred homeless men and women in Cambridge, making up a third of all supported housing in the city. They believe in homes not hostels and the majority of their accommodation is in 3-to 5-bed houses. They also offer specialised support and services for their residents, including an allotment project in the city which provides therapy and horticultural training for some of the most disadvantaged people in Cambridge.
